

1 Christ Church Garden

A lovely opening ceremony for our new wildlife border and historic and interpretation panel celebrated the work of partners and volunteers of all ages. We continue to receive positive comments on how this garden has improved safety and tranquillity in the church grounds.

2 Nelson Square and surrounds

The flower border in the square has had new planting and 5 tons of compost added to it, while key volunteers have kept the garden at Helen Gladstone House trimmed. We are working with the residents to revamp the planters by Rowland Hill House.

3 Red Cross Garden

The historic garden managed by ourselves continues to be beautiful and popular, we won a Green Pennant Award, applied for listing for the Sower Mosaic, dealt with safety issues, reviewed our environmental performance, and ran a full events and education programme including wildlife and history training for our volunteers.

4 Waterloo Millenium Green

BOST has now taken over the Green, and is supporting a local Steering Group to make decisions, run a programme of events, build on maintenance carried out by Putting Down Roots homeless gardeners, and rationalise seating and signs. We continue to work with the police and community support officers to combat problems around excessive drinking.

5 Community Garden at Tate Modern

This secret garden, accessible by resident's password, is a special place for our community. We are reviewing the needs of the current users to see how we can make the garden better, and working on attracting new groups to sign up to become 'friends' and users of the magic password.

6 Little Dorrit Play Park

Great improvements and repairs have been implemented at the playground this year. We have a new human sundial and new play equipment, including a very popular basket swing. A beautiful Dickens themed metal gate was designed with local children.

7 Mint Street Park and Playground

We are providing more trees, flowers, and grass as well as an outdoor gym, better recycling bins, improved surfaces, big improvements to the ball court, a climbing rockface and improvements to the play area. All working with our partners at Southwark.

8 Diversity Garden

Another year of profuse community vegetable growing, children's clubs and young people's breathing space has passed. We are all touched by the passion shown by local residents now campaigning to protect their garden in the face of development. We continue to work with developers to agree detail of a replacement garden.

9 St George's Garden

The section of Tabard Street outside will be pedestrianised and re-landscaped to rejoin the garden to the church. In the historic garden itself we are installing new flower borders, a small wildlife area and benches to provide an oasis of tranquillity.

10 Gambia Garden

Hard working volunteers have replaced many of the plants in the raised beds, removing those which had outgrown the space. New planting was kindly watered by a local resident.
